

Year 5 visit Stonehenge

Dear Parents,

I am delighted to announce that we have organised trips for Year 5 pupils to visit Stonehenge and the new English Heritage visitor centre. The dates are:

Friday 26th October for pupils in 5S and 5O
Thursday 14th February for pupils in 5R and 5A
Friday 24th May for pupils in 5C and 5N

We will leave school at 9am and will be travelling to and from the site by coach. Pupils should wear school uniform, trainers and take suitable waterproof outdoor clothing for the time of year. Pupils will need to bring with them a packed lunch and a drink, children who usually receive a free school meal can have a packed lunch provided by the school (please tick the box below indicating if you would like a school lunch, or wish to provide your own). We will return to school before the end of the school day, so normal after school arrangements will apply.

The purpose of the visit is to find out the history of Stonehenge, such as when and how it was built and why it has become a World Heritage site. Linked to the visit the children will be producing an information leaflet. The cost of the trip is £7.00 - please be aware that there will be no refunds due to sickness, or removal from the trip due to unacceptable behaviour. Payment options:-

Cash	Please do not send cash into school with your child – payments direct to the office, receipts will be issued.

There is a gift shop that we may be visiting (time dependent) so pupils can also take a maximum of £8.00 spending money. However it will be their responsibility to look after it all day.
